### **The Andrew Project -- Overview**

**Imagine:** If today every Christian prayed daily for 5 unbelievers and willingly shared the gospel with them. What would the church look like? To see how every Christian can willingly share the gospel, we can look at how Andrew did evangelism. (Mt. 4:18-20; Jn. 1:40-42; 6:8-9; 12:20-21; Acts 1:13-14)

**Purpose:** To help every Christian bring about a heart that's willing to share the gospel, to rely more on God, to understand how He guides them, to develop further an intimate and loving relationship between them and God, and to equip them specifically how to live out and speak about the good news of Jesus.

Timeline: 12 weeks

### **Process:**

- 1. Every believer is to <u>select 5 to 6 lost people</u> that they can have consistent personal interaction with over the next 6 to 9 months.
- 2. Pray everyday for 3 things:
  - a. For God to open a door to the Gospel
  - b. For God to open the hearts of the people we're praying for
  - c. For God to open our mouths and cause us to boldly share the gospel.
- 3. Do at least one <u>practical thing each month</u> to serve or bless each person to demonstrate God's love for us.
- 4. Every believer is to ask God to reveal a change in their heart due to following Jesus or ask God to tell them what change needs to be made in their heart. Afterwards, decide that with the power of the Holy Spirit they will show those changes in their heart specifically in the presence of unbelievers. For example, commit to say things that only build others up (Eph 4:29), seek only the good of others and not the good of yourself (1 Cor. 10:24), and/or be generous and willing to share (2 Cor. 9:6-11, 1 Tim. 6:18).
- 5. Every believer can share their personal testimony or "hope story."

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**Lesson 1 The Andrew Method** 

<u>Imagine:</u> If today every Christian prayed daily for 5 unbelievers and willingly shared the gospel with them, what would the church look like?

### WHY SHARE THE GOSPEL? THE GREAT COMMISSION

Mt. 28:18–20 (ESV) <sup>18</sup> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> therefore and of all nations, them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> them to observe
in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age."
When you hear "share the gospel", how does your heart respond? Why do we have so many brothers and sisters that are not willing to share the gospel frequently?
GOD'S WORK AND OUR SERVICE
Many brothers and sisters want to share the gospel and to serve God, but they have mistaken ideas about how we serve God. They think that success depends on their own efforts, abilities, knowledge, or experience. However, the Bible tells us something completely different about how to serve God.
Read the below verses about how we serve God.  John 15:5 (ESV) <sup>5</sup> I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.  Who can bear much fruit?
If we leave Jesus, what can we do?
John 16:7–11 (ESV) <sup>7</sup> Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, I will send him to you. <sup>8</sup> And when he comes, he will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment: <sup>9</sup> concerning sin, because they do not believe in me; <sup>10</sup> concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father, and you will see me no longer; <sup>11</sup> concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world is judged.  Who is the Helper?
Whose responsibility is it to "convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment?"
<b>Philippians 2:13 (ESV)</b> <sup>13</sup> for it is, both to will and to work for his good pleasure.

THE ANDREW METHOD
With his actions and his words, Andrew shared the gospel. We also must be able to "show" and "tell" people about Jesus. The only requirements to follow Andrew's example is to know unbelievers and love them. Any Christian can do this. From his life, we can see 5 things Andrew did that we can also do to bring others to Jesus.
Acts 17:26–27 (ESV) <sup>26</sup> And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth, having determined allotted periods and the boundaries of their dwelling place, <sup>27</sup> that they should seek God, and perhaps feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us,  According to these verses, what has God predetermined? (vs 26)
What is his desire for them? (vs 27)
The 1st Process: The main question: Who are the morals who still need to be reconciled to Cod that Cod.
The main question: Who are the people who still need to be reconciled to God that God has specially placed in your circle of influence? We should concentrate our efforts on

From among them, we should choose 5 or 6 people that we often have dealings with. It's best not to exceed 6 people, otherwise the burden is too great.

### The 4<sup>th</sup> Process:

### **Show – part 2: Lifestyle.**

We want every Christian to examine themselves regarding their character and holiness. They should think about what changes already have already occurred in their hearts because of God (including attitude, faith, compassion\kindness, morals, thoughts, actions, etc.) In order to conform to God's will for us they should think about which aspects God still should change. Everyday, they should live out these changes in front of unbelievers.

### The 5<sup>th</sup> Process:

During this course, we want every Christian to learn the skills of how to share their personal testimony (or "hope story"). We will also suggest other ways that you can share the gospel with others. By the end of this course, every Christian should have personally shared the gospel with the people they've selected.

### The Andrew Method - Review

Pray! Pray for God to reveal his will to us. Ask for God to give us a heart that desires to do God's will above all else! (Some basic verse summaries about God's will are provided below).

- God will accomplish all His purpose (Isaiah 46:10-11)
- God works all things according to the counsel of his will (Eph. 1:11)

- It is God's will that we be sanctified (1 Thess. 4:3)
- We should stand mature and fully assured in all the will of God (Col. 4:12)
- God will equip us with everything good that we may do his will (Heb. 13:21)
- Whoever does the will of God lives forever (1 John 2:17)

Pray! Pray for God to open the hearts of the lost so that those in our relational networks will repent and believe in Jesus.

Pray! Pray for God to give us a heart that desires for God's glory above all else.

Pray for the three "opens". Pray for God to open the heart of the lost, for God to open our mouths to share the Gospel, and for God to open a door to our message.

#### Lesson 6

True Faith: Depend on God

Memory Verses:

**Heb. 11:1:** Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen.

**Prov. 3:5:** Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding.

#### Lesson 14:

Ways to Share the Gospel: Personal Testimony

### **Personal Testimony**

"Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts, always being ready to make a defense to everyone who asks you to give an account for the hope that is in you, yet with gentleness and reverence;" 1 Peter 3:15

When people often met Jesus, they couldn't help but to tell other people about Him and what He had done for them. We should be the same. In this lesson, we will look at how we can use our personal testimonies to share the gospel with others.

### I. What is a personal testimony?

A. Personal Testimony of Salvation

A personal testimony of salvation describes how a person became a Christian and the differences in their life before and after they became a follower of Jesus. In Acts 26:2-29, Paul gives us a good model of how to share our testimony. According to his model, we can make our own testimony of salvation for the purpose of sharing the gospel.

### How to share a personal testimony of salvation:

- 1. Before you believed the Lord: What kind of person were you before you believed the Lord? What were your actions and your thinking like?
- 2. How you believed in the Lord: What was the situation when you believed? What was the turning point? Include the gospel.
- 3. After you believed in the Lord: What changes are there in your life behaviors and in your heart's thinking? Since believing in the Lord, what blessings and grace has God given you?
- 4. Give people a chance to respond and accept Jesus.

### B. Personal Testimony of God's Grace/Blessing

A personal testimony of God's grace describes how a person's life has been changed because of your relationship with Jesus. For example, Andrew told his brother Peter about Jesus, and Philip told his friend Nathaniel about Jesus (Jn 1:35-46), the Samaritan woman told her townspeople about Jesus and what he did (Jn 4:39-42), and those Jesus healed told others about Him and his works (Mk. 5:1-20; 7:31-37; Lk. 4:31-37; 7:11-17; Jn. 9:1-11)

#### How to share a personal testimony of receiving God's grace/blessing:

- 1. Before you received grace: Describe your original situation, problem, or state of affairs.
- 2. Result of receiving grace: Describe how your relationship with Jesus and the grace you received affected the situation, problem, or state of affairs. For example, God answered a prayer, in the middle of difficulty God gave you strength, God supplied your need, through the church or a Scripture God encouraged you, God used a bad thing and changed it for your benefit, etc.
- 3. How to receive grace: People cannot obtain God's favor or help through being good people. It is only through a relationship with Jesus that people are able to rely on God and receive God's blessings. Include the gospel.
- 4. Give people a chance to respond and accept Jesus.

### II. Why do we share our own testimony?

A. It's a good way to share the gospel.

It's an easy way to share the gospel since you already know the details of your story. No one can argue with your experience.

B. It shows others the practical benefits of being a Christian and how Jesus can change their life.

#### III. Suggestions for sharing our testimony

- 1. We should be prepared at all times to share our testimony. (1 Peter 3:15) We should know our testimony very well. As a result, we are always prepared to "give an account of the hope that is in you."
- 2. Intentionally share your testimony
  Very few people will ask you to share your testimony or to share the gospel. Therefore,
  we must take the initiative to tell them.
- 3. We should always look for opportunities to share with others. Some very direct ways include asking questions such as,
  - "Do you ever think about spiritual things?"
  - "What is the most important thing in the world to you?" or
  - "Can I share with you the most important discovery of my life?" or
  - "Have you ever been to a church?" or
  - "Do you believe in God?"

Once you have turned the conversation to spiritual things you can usually find a way to naturally share an account of how you came to follow the Lord.

4. Having a prepared testimony is a good way to share the gospel with anyone who: is facing a similar situation that you previously faced when God helped you. wants to know why you are a Christian

wants to know what are the practical benefits/blessings of being a Christian, or wants to know how God works in your life.

5. Give people a chance to respond.

After sharing his testimony, Paul encouraged people listening to him to respond to believe Jesus. After we share our testimony, we too should give people a chance to respond and accept Jesus.

### **IV. Preparing Your Personal Testimony**

- A. According to the above instructions, prepare your own testimony.
- B. A testimony should be only 3-4 minutes long. It isn't necessary to include every detail of your story.
- C. When writing your testimony, it is best to use a story telling method.
- D. Don't use church words because unbelievers won't understand our meaning.

- E. Some people who were saved at an early age find it better to use the testimony of God's grace since unbelievers may think their decision to follow Jesus was not informed or their decision was not their own but only because of their family's influence.



God loves everyone including you and me. When our thinking, ideas or attitudes are wrong, our relationship with God is broken.




### 3. that he gave his one and only Son
